Milton

OVERVIEW

Milton is a town in Norfolk County with the most privately and publicly conserved land within 20 miles of Boston so it has lots of green space. It is an affluent suburb of Boston and the birthplace of former President of George H.W. Bush. But it is very close to Boston and borders Dorchester, Mattapan, Hyde Park, Quincy, Randolph and Canton. Milton has about 27, 600 residents within about 13 square miles. Milton is home to a famous private prep school – Milton Academy – attended by former Governor Deval Patrick and several members of the Kennedy family and to Curry College.

Served by the Ashmont-Mattapan High Speed Line, an extension of the red line. Routes 28 and 138 run through Milton and I-93, which is also Route 1 and route 3 at that location, goes around it.


