# Wakefield

Wakefield is in Middlesex County about 12.5 miles northwest of downtown Boston. It is a town of 26,960 in 7.9 square miles and borders Reading, Melrose, Stoneham, Lynnfield and Saugus. It mostly has a small town feel with a cute downtown. However, the commuter rail can take you from Wakefield to Boston. Wakefield has a beautiful lake that has a playground at its edge and offers boating and other recreational opportunities.

Wakefield has a beautiful 247 acre lake – Lake Quannapowitt – for recreation including kayaking. There is playground on its shore and a paved loop around it for running and walking and typically an annual festival next to the lake with arts, crafts and kids' activities. There is also a weekly farmer's market next to the lake. The town keeps a community calendar of events. Linden Tree Coffee house hosts concerts.


