OVERVIEW

Watertown is in Middlesex County and borders Belmont, Newton, Brighton and Cambridge. It is fairly dense with 35,103 residents in 4.2 square miles. Its housing stock is a mix of single family homes and multi-family dwellings, some of which are condos and others are for rent. It is known for being the site of a large Armenian population and therefore has a fair number of middle eastern stores and bakeries.

LOCAL AMENITIES

Watertown is experiencing a boom in construction including many new rental units and the new Arsenal Yards Shopping Center. It is home to a large part of the famous and beautiful Mt. Auburn Cemetery which you can walk through (the rest of the cemetery is in Cambridge). The Charles River runs through Watertown and there are nice biking and walking parks along the river. The large Armenian population means there are several middleeastern grocery stores. There are a wide range of grocery stores such as Shaws but also including the famous Russos which serves many area restaurants but has a low-cost retail operation with tons of great fruit and vegetables and baked goods. Watertown is the home of the Plumbing Museum. Other amenities include: John Ryan Skating rink, a Boys and Girls Club, and an outdoor pool with a spray deck. The Watertown Recreation department offers summer camps, youth tennis, pre-K Sports, drawing class and adult tennis.
