Over the past two years, the pandemic added exceptional challenges for us, specifically the need to accommodate the significant changes to the workflow brought on by the shift from in-person to a hybrid staffing model, and from paper-based to electronic-based applications and other processes.

### In FY22, Metro Housing:

- Administered rental assistance vouchers for 11,703 households
- Distributed \$163 million in emergency housing payment assistance
- Served 975 households through **Colocation sites**
- Served 886 families and individuals through ACO (Accountable Care Organization) **Flex Services**
- Conducted more than 42,000 counseling sessions via the **Housing Hub (Housing Consumer Education Center/HCEC)**
- **Closed 20 Home Modification** Loans valued at \$631,532
