

Burlington



OVERVIEW

Burlington is a dense suburb with a mix of rental and single-family homes. It has more technology companies and industry than many of the suburbs and it offers more opportunities for jobs than many other communities. There is also a wide range of shopping opportunities, including one of the state's largest malls – the Burlington Mall. Burlington has approximately 27,000 residents and is about 12 square miles. Even with all this density, there are plenty of nice green spaces such as the reservoir (where you can hike but not swim) and playgrounds. Burlington borders Billerica, Wilmington, Woburn, Lexington and is 12 miles Northwest of Boston.

TRANSPORTATION

Routes 124/I-05, 3, 3A and 62 run through Burlington. MBTA and Lowell Regional Transit buses run through the town. The nearest commuter rail station is in Woburn The nearest T stops are in Cambridge and Medford. It is possible to get to Boston via public transportation in an hour and fifteen minutes.
