OVERVIEW

Wilmington is a suburban community with a mix of residential neighborhoods, commercial districts and industrial parks. Wilmington has a population of 22,300 in 17.2 square miles. It is 15 miles North of Boston and borders Andover, North Reading, Reading, Woburn, Burlington, Billerica, and Tewksbury. The town's reputation as a strong and supportive community, with its close proximity to highways, the commuter rail, and activities for all ages, continues to make Wilmington an attractive place to live and work.

Evidence of Wilmington's community spirit can be found during the year at various activities held throughout the town. The Annual Easter Egg Hunt, Summer Concerts on the Common, Fourth-of-July Festivities, and Holiday Tree-Lighting Ceremony are just some of the events that provide families and friends an opportunity to come together.

LOCAL AMENITIES

Silver Lake has a small beach and offers swimming during warm weather. The Wilmington Town Common and Rotary Park are in the center of town. There are several parks and public recreation facilities throughout town with walking paths, soccer fields, baseball diamonds, and other athletic facilities. Yentile Farm Recreational Facility is a newly opened nature inspired playground near the center of town.

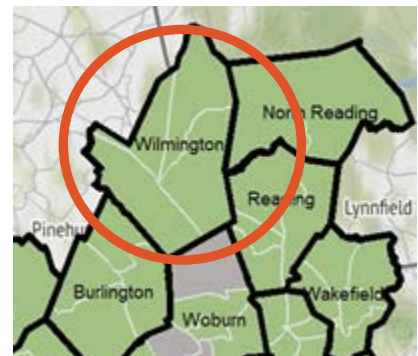
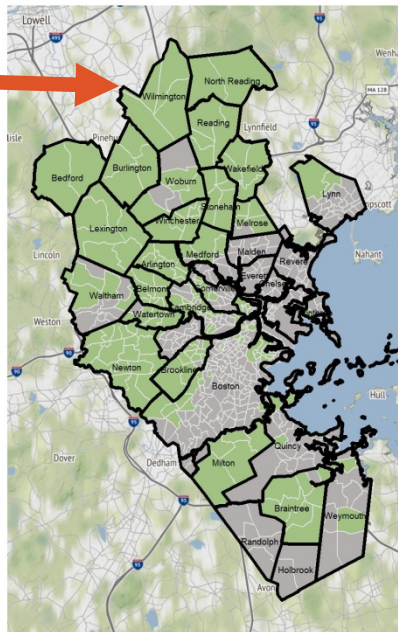
The Recreation Department offers programs for youth and adults, including several sports, science, math, cooking and dance. It also offers discounted movie tickets. Shriners Auditorium is a 2,650-seat indoor arena, home of Boston Roller Derby women's flat track roller derby league. Ristuccia Ice Arena: the former practice rink of the Boston Bruins, offers ice skating lessons. The Wilmington Memorial library hosts a wide variety of events, including many for kids, and has passes to museums and other cultural attractions.
