### WELCOME TO METRO HOUSING BOSTON'S FY23 IMPACT REPORT

#### Dear Friends,

Metro Housing has much to share. Not only have we reached nearly 12,000 families served through our federal and state voucher programs, but we distributed more than \$44 million through the state-funded RAFT (Residential Assistance for Families in Transition) program to more than 8,300 families.

As the number of families in Massachusetts who are homeless continues to increase to its highest level in history, so does the continued high demand for our services along the continuum from homelessness prevention to economic self-sufficiency. Our dedicated team of Housing Specialists, Case Managers, Inspectors, and administrative staff will continue to work hard every day to meet the needs of our participants and property owners.

Metro Housing recognizes that to make inroads into the Commonwealth's affordable housing crisis, Massachusetts residents deserve significant policy changes on Beacon Hill. We will continue to advocate for changes that will benefit the housing stability for low and very low-income families.


